ORDER OF WORSHIP MAY 24, 2020


*CALL TO WORSHIP | Psalm 9:1-2, 7-8, 11

CORPORATE CONFESSION

Let us pray:

God of everlasting love, we confess that we have been unfaithful to our covenant with you and with one another. We have worshiped other gods: money, power, greed, and convenience. We have put these things before you and served them rather than serving you. Forgive us. We confess that we have served our own self-interest instead of serving you and your people. We have not loved our neighbor as you have commanded. We have sought our own desires, wants, and longings at the expense of considering the needs of one another as more important than our own. Father, forgive us. We have broken your commandments and not loved our neighbor nor have we rightly loved you. Forgive us and be gracious to us. Restore us to yourself and one another. We pray in the name of Jesus and confess our sins silently before you...

SILENT CONFESSION

ASSURANCE OF PARDON | John 15:12-15

"This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. No longer do I call you servants, for the servant does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends, for all that I have heard from my Father I have made known to you."
