THE LORD'S SUPPER | *See comments below*

We come forward by row to receive the elements. Wine is found in red cups (outer ring), grape juice in clear cups (inside rings). Gluten free wafers are available in both serving lines. If you are unable to come forward, please notify the server walking around with the elements. You are welcome to participate in the Lord's Supper if you are a baptized Christian and a member of an evangelical church. If this does not describe you, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer to consider your relationship to Jesus Christ. We also ask that children who have not yet publicly professed their faith in Christ refrain from partaking until doing so. The Lord's Supper is a time for our faith to be strengthened and our hope renewed.

ADULT CLASSES Discussions on Racial Healing

Led by Glen Berkel and Lisa Spencer

How do we get past the divisiveness that plagues racial discussions today? This class will move beyond the language that keeps us divided and examine the root of the problem. By exploring the biblical narrative, underlying sins that cause the fractures will be exposed. A historical sketch will reveal how these sins have manifested in the American church and have produced partiality, animosity and failure to embrace our corporate identity in Christ. We will also discuss how we as Christians today can and should engage this issue with presenting gospel centered solutions.

We will be meeting at 7pm on Monday's via Zoom and each class will be recorded.

MISSIONS

Friendship House, a Christian community center in SW Roanoke, continues to serve families through an after-school program and a food pantry. They are loving their neighbors well through these ministries and inviting them to learn more about God's love for them. They are also committed to connecting the local church to their neighbors through outreach programs.

Please pray for an Afghan refugee family of 5 who live in the apartment in Friendship House. Pray for opportunities for the gospel to be communicated to them. Pray also for families who come to the food pantry who are struggling with cancer or have recently lost someone to cancer. Pray for mercy and ability to minister to them effectively.

They thank God to be able to serve 120 households with emergency food each week, thanks to local congregations helping to stock the pantry. This is 3x the number served pre-Covid. Praise God, also, containing a COVID case in October to one family and did not affect neighborhood families, volunteers, or staff.

There are several opportunities for CTK to get involved in Friendship House's ministry. Volunteers are needed to prepare or deliver food pantry boxes on Wednesdays or Thursdays and to help with the after-school program on Tuesdays, Thursdays, or Fridays. Our church is also collecting food items for Thanksgiving boxes to be given to families; see the table by the front door for more information and to drop off items.
