In his book *Surviving Religion 101*, Christian scholar Dr. Michael Kruger writes "there is nothing more foundational, nothing more central, to your health as a Christian than maintaining a deep and abiding trust in the truth of God's word." Yet there are many questions that may cause us to doubt that the Bible is trustworthy. Where did the Bible I hold in my hands come from? Did mere men simply pick and choose these books to advance their own agenda? Were some books from God left out? Do we still have God's original words or did scribes make mistakes (or even intentional changes) so that the original words are now lost? At the end of the day, can I trust what I am reading? When the Pharisees famously attempted to trap Jesus with a question about divorce in Matthew 19, Jesus responded by grounding marriage and sexual intimacy in the gender complementarity God had created, saying in verses 4-5, “Have you not read that he who created them from the beginning made them male and female, and said, ‘Therefore a man shall leave his father and his mother and hold fast to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh?’” And yet we are living in a world that has become increasingly hostile both to our Lord’s teaching and to the Church’s commitment to him and his word. So how do we speak the truth about human sexuality to a world that desperately needs to hear it? And, how do we do this with genuine love and compassion for our neighbor? The PCA’s recently published and commended report on human sexuality provides helpful answers to these and many other questions. Come and join us as we consider and discuss this report’s “Twelve Statements.”
