





The first system of the song features a treble and bass staff in 4/4 time with a key signature of one flat. The melody in the treble staff begins with a half rest, followed by quarter notes G4, A4, Bb4, and C5, then a half note D5, and ends with a quarter note C5 and a half rest. The bass staff provides accompaniment with chords: G2-Bb2 (half), A2-Bb2 (half), C3-D3 (half), and E3-F3 (half).

The second system continues the melody and accompaniment from the first system, maintaining the same musical structure and lyrics.

The third system introduces a new melody in the treble staff, starting with a half rest, followed by quarter notes G4, A4, Bb4, and C5, then a half note D5, and ending with a quarter note C5 and a half rest. The bass staff continues with the same accompaniment as the previous systems.

The fourth system returns to the original melody and accompaniment of the first system, concluding the song with a double bar line.

We come forward by row to receive the elements. Wine is found in red cups (outer ring), grape juice in clear cups (inside rings). Gluten free wafers are available in both serving lines. If you are unable to come forward, please notify the server walking around with the elements. You are welcome to participate in the Lord's Supper if you are a baptized Christian and a member of an evangelical church. If this does not describe you, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer to consider your relationship to Jesus Christ. We also ask that children who have not yet publicly professed their faith in Christ refrain from partaking until doing so. The Lord's Supper is a time for our faith to be strengthened and our hope renewed.

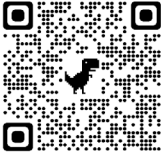
