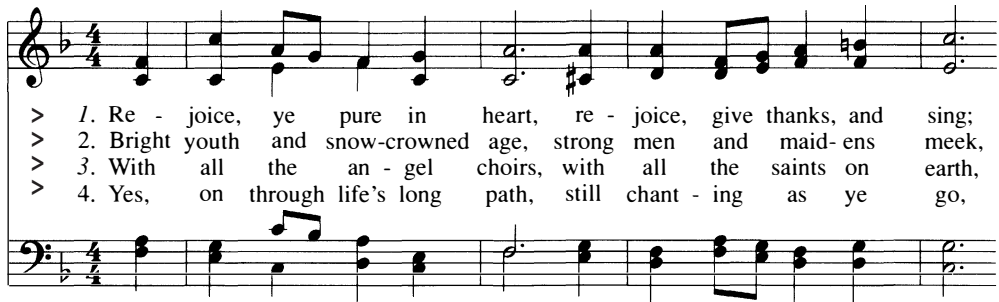

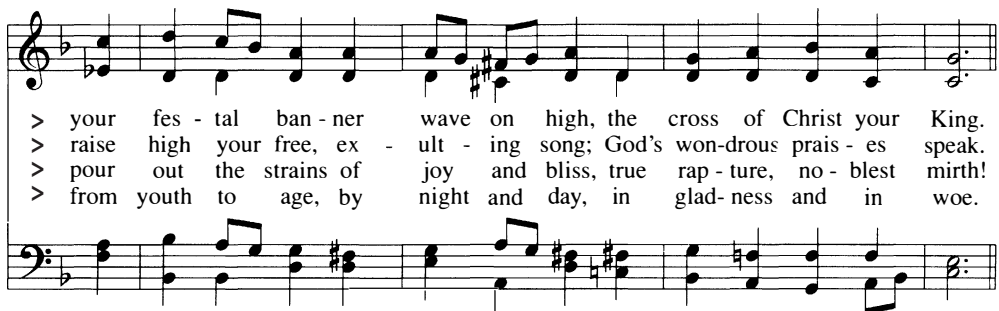

RUF - London - Ben Spivey

Last week, the Spivey family attended Pre-Field Training in Atlanta, Georgia. The training includes cultural understanding, contextualization, team dynamics, and more. Jude, Audrey, and Ruby met other missionary kids and began learning about moving to a different culture. The Spiveys connected with Emma and Mary Neil, RUF interns who found out RUF was starting in the UK and wanted be part of it. They moved to London in September and started working with London City Presbyterian to begin RUF. The Spiveys are connecting occasionally on FaceTime with the Neils to talk about ministry, culture change, and getting to know each other.
