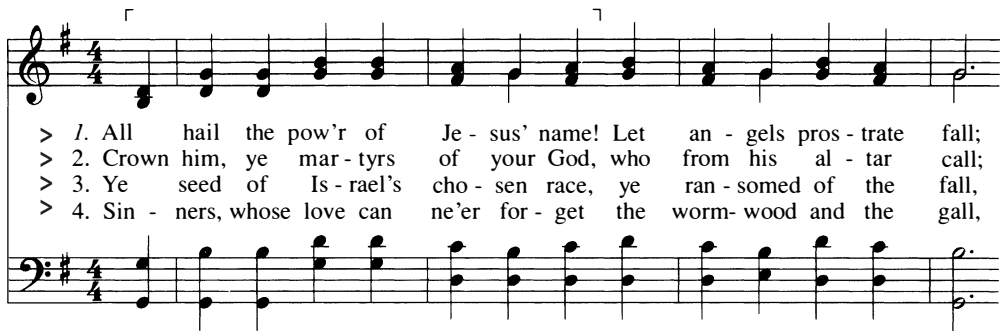

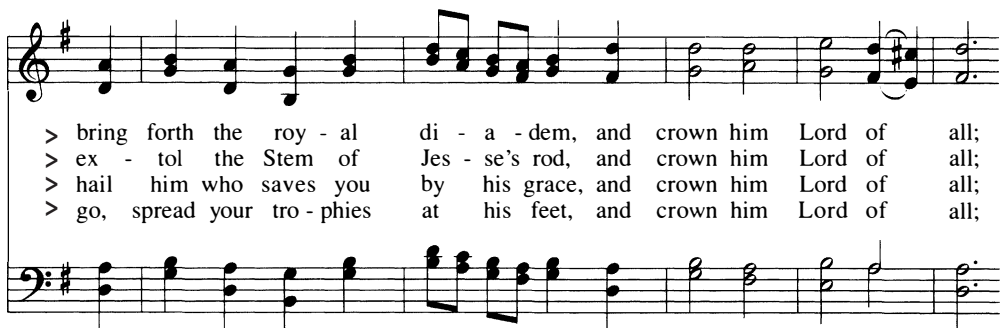

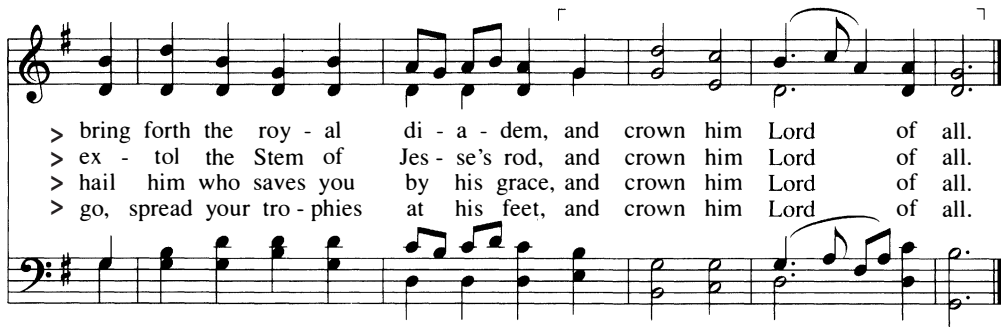

Welcome Bert and Nancy Williams!

We are deeply grateful to the saints at CTK for your faithful support over the years. Your prayers, encouragement, and generosity have been a true blessing to us and have made our ministry possible. For the past twelve years, we have had the privilege of serving in Uganda. Bert has worked closely with pastors and church leaders, helping them strengthen their churches both numerically and spiritually. His focus has been on developing reproducible networks of churches that seek to impact their communities through the power of the gospel. Alongside this work, Nancy has continued her lifelong calling in education. She works primarily with village schools where access to training is limited, partnering with a team to equip teachers to teach all subjects from a Christian worldview. This integration of faith and learning does not always occur, even in Christian schools, making this work especially important. As we approach retirement, we rejoice that God has brought these two teams together and that the ministry we have been part of will continue. We are thankful for the opportunity to have served and for the assurance that the work in Uganda will carry on, bearing fruit for years to come.
