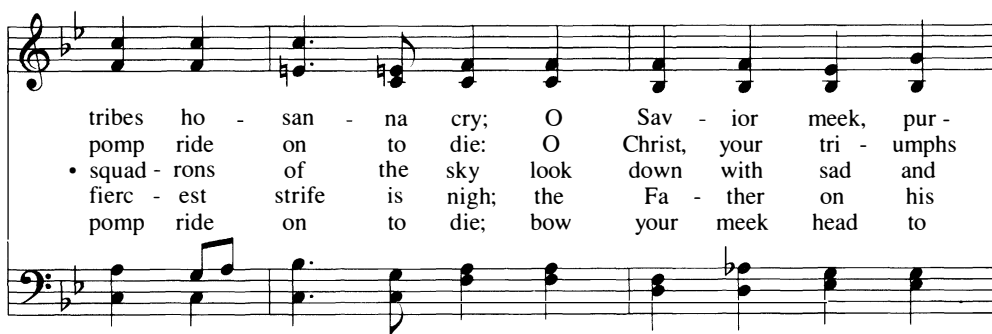

THE LORD'S SUPPER | *See comments below*

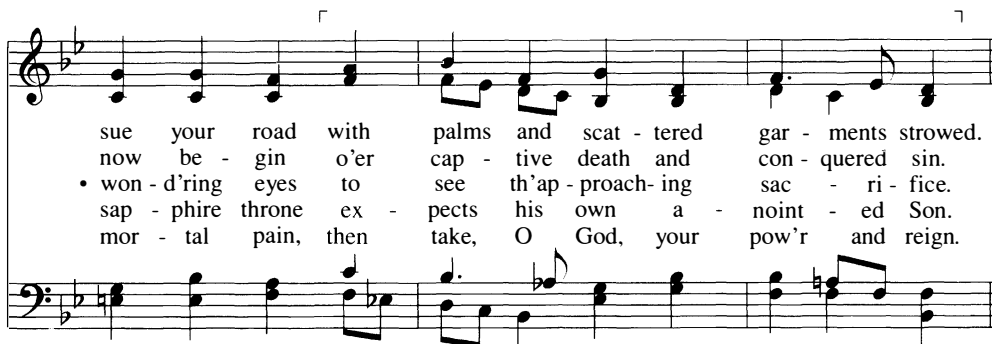
