Let us pray:

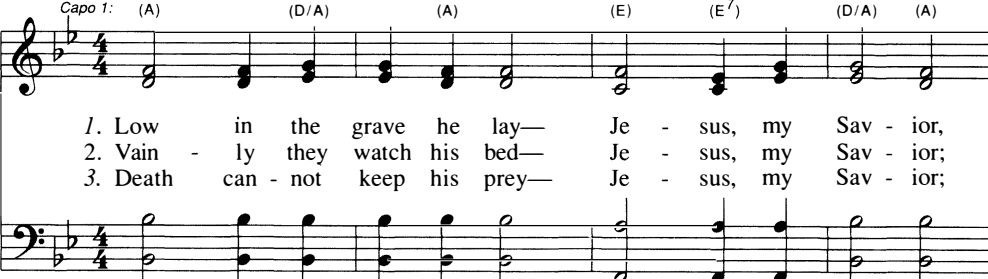

ASSURANCE OF PARDON | 1 Peter 2:22-24

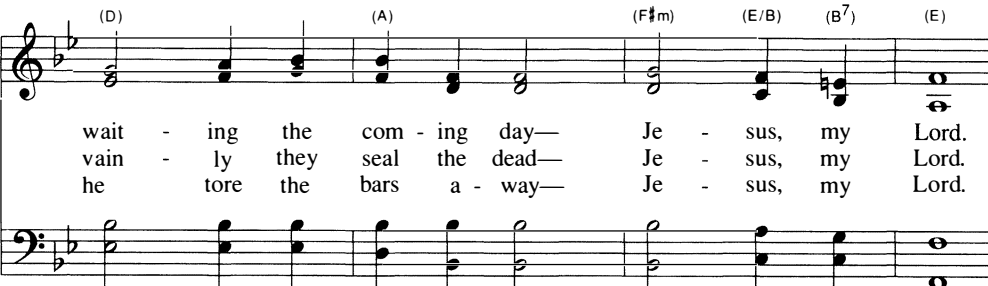

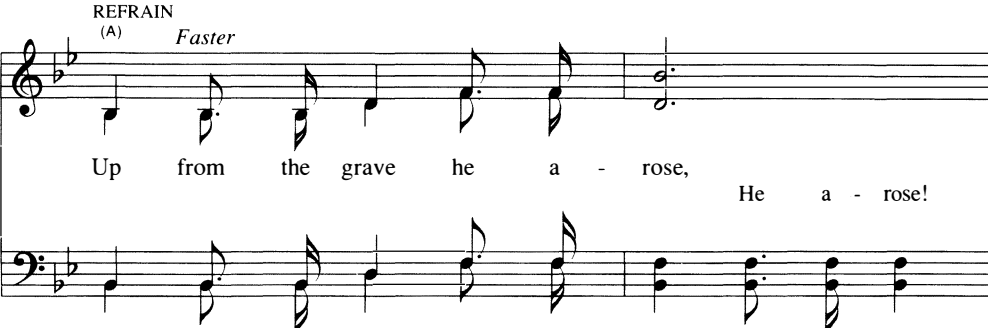

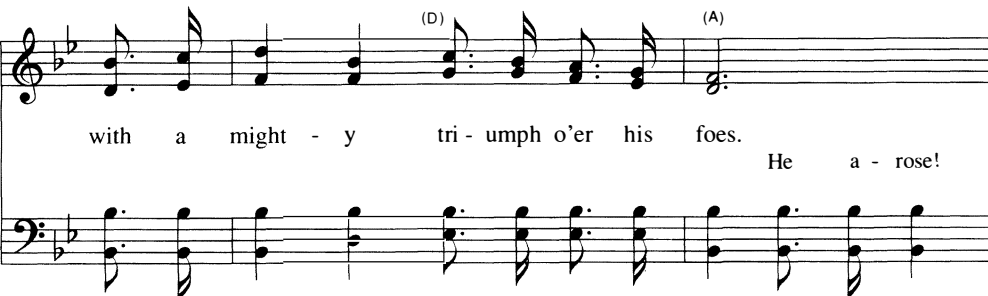

If you are unable to come forward, please notify the server walking around with the elements. If this does not describe you, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer to consider your relationship to Jesus Christ. We also ask that children who have not yet publicly professed their faith in Christ refrain from partaking until doing so.
